During the southern hemisphere summer of 2019/2020, Adventure Consultants will operate an expedition to ski in the Ellsworth Mountains in Antarctica. This Ski Antarctica trip offers the opportunity for backcountry skiers to carve first tracks on pristine slopes in the world's most remote environment.

The Heritage Range that will be our playground for this expedition has the breadth of terrain to suit any experience level, with unparalleled views in all directions and options for multi-day trips or day tours from our base at Union Glacier Camp.

Enjoy the exploration as a trip in itself, or as an add-on to our Vinson Massif or South Pole expeditions to complete your Antarctic experience.

Brief History

Union Glacier is located in the Heritage Range amongst the Ellsworth Mountains, 1,300km/700 nautical miles from the South Pole. These mountains are the highest in Antarctica and include Vinson Massif (4,892m/16,050ft), the continent's highest peak.

The mountains were discovered on 23 November 1935 by Lincoln Ellsworth on a trans-Antarctic flight and he named them the Sentinel Range. The Canadian company Adventure Network International (ANI) opened up this area to private expeditions and operated regular flights to its summer camp at Patriot Hills from 1985. In 2003/2004 they

withdrew their Antarctic operations and Antarctica Logistics & Expeditions (ALE) stepped in. ALE is run by some of the same people that initially started ANI back in the 1980s and they now use a new camp at Union Glacier as their base within Antarctica.

The terrain and skiing in the area is varied with routes ranging from easy to technical levels. Under the leadership of experienced Antarctic guides, backcountry skiers of varying levels of experience can safely undertake the trip.

Access to the Mountains

From Punta Arenas at the tip of Chile, we fly by Ilyushin 76 aircraft to the ALE base at Union Glacier. Here the aircraft makes a wheeled landing on a natural blue-ice runway.

The Union Glacier Camp, situated at 80 degrees South is a small collection of 'clam-style' tents. These have double walls to withstand Antarctic conditions, with a high-tech nylon covering and durable aluminium frames that open up like a clam shell. They are tall enough to stand up in and incorporate a wooden floor to provide solid footing and insulation from the snow. Guests will also have access to the camp's dining tent where residents gather to share buffet-style meals.

Depending on our skiing objectives, we will travel from Union Glacier into the nearby mountains where we may spend several nights camping.

Level of Experience Required

To join our Ski Antarctica Expedition you should have a good level of fitness, as those who are "mountain-fit" when they arrive in Antarctica will enjoy it far more! Expedition members should have good leg strength and strong overall cardio fitness.

Because the skiing is varied, we can tailor the objectives to meet your experience level. Members with modest backcountry skiing backgrounds can join this expedition but some overall cold camping experience and previous backcountry or off-piste ski experience is recommended.

Meeting Point

The expedition members will gather in Punta Arenas, Chile. Daily flights on LAN Chile and Ladeco Airlines connect with Santiago and other points to the north. As the group gear must be weighed and loaded at least one day prior to departure for Union Glacier and you must attend the expedition briefing, you are advised to schedule your arrival in Punta Arenas accordingly. Thus, you must arrive on or before the scheduled **Day 1**.

Itinerary

December 15 – 30, 2019

Day 1	Meet in Punta Arenas, Chile
Day 2-3	Weighing and loading of gear, expedition briefing
Day 4	Fly to Union Glacier, Antarctica
Day 5 – 7	Expedition Preparations
Day 8 – 14	Ski safari
Day 15	Depart for Punta Arenas
Day 16	Leave for home

Please note: Flights to and from Antarctica are subject to weather. Delays can and often do occur therefore it is important to allow some flexibility with airline travel arrangements at the end of the expedition.

Detailed Itinerary

Days 1-3

We will arrange a specific time to come to your hotel and review your personal clothing and equipment. Please lay out all of the items on our Required Clothing and Equipment List in your hotel room so we can go through each item with you. We will help sort the items to pack in your checked luggage vs. your carry-on bag and what items to leave behind in Punta Arenas.

The evening before your Antarctic flight, you are required to attend an important safety briefing to be followed by cocktails and hors d'oeuvres. At the briefing, we will describe the flight dispatch process, update you on the current weather and prepare you for arrival at Union Glacier. Please stay to enjoy pisco sours served over ancient Antarctic ice with your fellow travellers.

Day 4: Fly to Antarctica

We will call you at your hotel in the morning to advise you of current conditions in Antarctica. If the weather is suitable for our flight, we will pick you up at your hotel within the hour. Please meet us in the lobby with hotel bills paid, ready to board the bus. At the Punta Arenas airport, we board our chartered jet for the 4¼ hour flight to Antarctica. Our route crosses the Drake Passage, then follows the west side of the Antarctic Peninsula and the spine of the Ellsworth Mountains. We land on a naturally occurring blue-ice runway on Union Glacier where you will take your first steps on Antarctica. Climb aboard one of our specially-adapted vans for the 8km/5 mile shuttle to our main camp. Our friendly staff will provide a welcome tour of camp and show you to your tent.

*Every effort will be made to keep to the scheduled flight date and we will depart as soon as weather and runway conditions permit. Please understand that delays are common in

Antarctic travel. All flights are dependent on weather, aircraft serviceability and local conditions. Our staff will stay in close contact with you and will provide you with regular flight updates.

Day 5 - 7: Expedition Preparations

Your climbing team will spend the first few days at Union Glacier brushing up on skills and getting acclimatised to the Antarctic conditions. You'll practice rope work, crevasse rescue, navigation, weather observations and polar camping skills. During this period, you will also discuss and plan your objectives with your guide and pack your equipment to ready for departure. While based in Union Glacier Camp, you may also have time to join an excursion to one of the near-by scenic destinations such as the Drake Icefall or the beach at Rossman Cove.

Day 8 - 14: Ski Safari

It's time to explore Antarctica as it should be, untracked and pristine. The opportunities for discovery are endless, whether you are looking for steep lines, first descents or gentle, scenic ski tours. Only a handful of people have passed through this terrain and it is exhilarating to think that you may be one of the only people to stand on a summit, set tracks on a slope or marvel at the view below. Numerous valleys grant access to the snowy peaks of the Enterprise Hills, Pioneer Heights and Soholt Peaks. In recent years, snowfalls have created consistently good skiing conditions with boot-top powder in some areas. You and your guide will develop a custom expedition plan tailored to your personal skillset and pursuits. Take on local day trips and return home to Union Glacier Camp each evening for dinner or set out on a multiday expedition to explore various peaks in the Heritage Range. Once your skiing dreams are fulfilled, you'll return to Union Glacier Camp to enjoy a celebration dinner and toast your achievements!

Day 15: Fly to Punta Arenas

When weather and runway conditions permit, our intercontinental aircraft will arrive at Union Glacier to transport you back to Chile. Our staff will meet you at the airport and transfer you back to your hotel.

Day 16: Flexible Departure Day

We recommend booking your flight home one week after your return Antarctic flight. If you purchase a full-fare ticket, most airlines will allow you to move your departure date. It is important to give yourself a buffer as delays are common in Antarctic travel. We can assist with details of local tour operators and excursions if you wish to explore Chile before you return home.

Hotels

Adventure Consultants can book your hotel in Punta Arenas or you can take care of this yourself. Please advise us at the time of booking.

Visa Requirements

Expedition members must secure their own visa for multiple-entry into Chile. While Chile claims part of the Antarctic Continent as its sovereignty, it requires that we check through immigration when leaving for and returning from Antarctica, thus a multi-entry visa is required.

Team Membership

The Ski Antarctica expedition can operate at different guide-to-skier ratios, depending on the ambitions of the group and the technical difficulty of the objectives. You will find the ski guides companionable and strong expedition leaders with considerable power and willingness to see you achieve your goals.

The Expedition Fee

The cost of the expedition **ex Punta Arenas in Chile** is **US\$30,950**.

This is an inclusive cost and covers the following:

- Airport transfers in Punta Arenas, Chile
- Round trip flight to Antarctica from Punta Arenas
- Meals and tented accommodation in Antarctica
- Group camping and climbing equipment
- All expedition organisational requirements
- Ski guide
- Celebration dinner and certificate of achievement
- Checked luggage up to 25kg/55lb

The expedition fee does **not include** the following:

- Insurance coverage — personal, medical, evacuation or otherwise
- Commercial flights to and from Punta Arenas
- Chilean visa and airport fees
- Airport transfers outside of Punta Arenas
- Meals and accommodation in Punta Arenas
- Additional flights within Antarctica

- Personal equipment and clothing
 - Expenses incurred due to delays
 - Excess baggage transportation charges of US\$77 per kg for any baggage exceeding the personal equipment weight limit
 - Satellite phone charges
 - Photos from Ski Antarctica
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Deposit

A **non-refundable deposit of US\$5,000** is payable to secure a place on the expedition.

Balance

The balance is payable **120 days** before the trip departure date.

We can also accept your deposit and balance payment by credit card (Visa, Mastercard or Amex) plus a 3% credit card fee.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

An expedition member may cancel their participation on the following basis:

- Cancellations outside of 120 days of the departure date incur the loss of the deposit payment.

- Cancellations between 119-90 days of the departure date incur 50% of the balance payment.
 - For cancellation made within 89 days of the departure date there will be no refunds.
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Trip Cancellation Insurance

Team members should take out private cancellation insurance if they wish to be covered against cancellation due to medical or personal reasons. This is called trip cancellation insurance and can be obtained through your normal travel agent. You will also need to procure rescue insurance.

Equipment List

A full clothing and equipment checklist will be sent to all expedition members, once their booking is confirmed. Our Equipment Co-ordinator will be available prior to the trip to provide advice and discuss individual equipment questions.

Medical Examination

Expedition members will be provided with pre-trip medical advice and a medical questionnaire and asked to visit their family physician and receive a full medical examination. This information will be sighted only by the expedition leader and our medical adviser and treated with full confidentiality.

Documentation & Photographs

Expedition members will be requested to provide 2 passport photographs and a copy of their climbing résumé.
